

Public talk: From Godalming to Burkina Faso:- A Morning of Hope and Inspiration

The Guildford & District Knights of St Columba are delighted to invite the public to an inspiring illustrated talk on Saturday **20 September 2025** from 10.30am to 11.45am at Our Lady Help of Christians Roman Catholic Church in West Byfleet.

The talk will be given by Gillie Nicholls-Penny, founder of Les Amis Burkina Faso (Friends of Burkina Faso), a Godalming based registered UK charity dedicated to serving the poor and needy of one of the world's most impoverished nations.



With firsthand insights and powerful stories, Gillie will showcase the charity's work in education, healthcare and community development and will be happy to take questions from the audience. Founded with the belief that everyone deserves dignity and opportunity, the charity has grown from local roots in Godalming into a vital lifeline for many in West Africa.

The Pilgrimage of Hope is a national walking pilgrimage for England & Wales with four main Ways converging at the Cathedral of St Barnabas, Nottingham, on Saturday 13th September 2025, eve of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.




It is an initiative of the Hearts in Search of God project. The Ways start at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich and St George's Catholic Cathedral, Southwark, London (see map above) and will bless our nations with a Sign of the Cross. The routes use established hiking routes and are off road as much as possible. A small group of 'perpetual pilgrims' will walk the full distance of each Way, with up to 20-day pilgrims joining for day stages. There are potential feeder routes to the four main Ways from all the other Catholic cathedrals of England & Wales.







Border Security, Asylum and Immigration Bill

The new government has an opportunity to fix this and build a fairer, more humane system – but their first piece of immigration legislation, going through parliament right now, is a missed opportunity.

This bill misses a vital opportunity to create a fair and humane asylum system.

While this bill repeals some particularly harmful policies of the last government (for example, the [Rwanda Plan](#)) – it also introduces dangerous new provisions which risk criminalising people seeking safety.

Another problem of the bill is its framing: it continues a long and dangerous trend of talking about asylum as a border security issue rather than a protection issue, and of crafting law and policy accordingly. Consistently associating 'national security' with people seeking sanctuary stokes division and distrust, framing seeking asylum as a threat. It is not hard to see the dangers of this: less than a year ago [the country was shocked by criminal violence targeting people seeking sanctuary](#).

We should be focussed on making it safer and easier for refugees to find protection, rather than building a fortress.

Ways we could build a better and fairer asylum system

Create safe routes for refugees to come to the UK

This would reduce reliance on small boats and other dangerous modes of travel.

Restore the right to work to asylum seekers

Most people seeking asylum are not permitted to work. This consigns them to deep poverty, obliges them to be reliant on Home Office support to meet their basic needs, and makes it harder for them to take up work when they are recognised as refugees. Restoring the full right to work to people seeking safety would be good for asylum seekers' mental health, support integration, and save public money.

End the use of immigration detention

Until this happens, introduce a 28-day time limit, ensure the decision to detain a person goes before a judge, and implement the recommendations of the Brook House Inquiry. JRS UK's report [After Brook House](#) demonstrates the abuse and harm endemic across the UK's detention estate, and makes recommendations for an entirely different approach.




Many of the world's poorest countries have been plunged into a new debt crisis, and in this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis called for urgent action to address it.

Involve your parish in our debt campaign



The number of low and middle-income countries in debt crisis has more than doubled since 2015: 54 countries are now in debt crisis compared with 22 countries in 2015.

Despite facing significant poverty burdens, countries are having to make huge repayments on high-interest loans to wealthy banks, institutions and governments, leaving them unable to properly fund essential services.



In Africa, 34 countries spend more on external debt payments than on health or education, when hospitals and schools are already desperately underfunded.

Debts are being paid at the expense of hiring doctors and teachers, building schools, hospitals and sewage systems, preparing for floods, or coping with droughts.

Often, countries have repaid their original debt several times over, but the debt will never be cleared because the interest on it keeps growing.





Two Paths to the Sacred: Indigenous Wisdom Meets Metaphysical Verse at St Augustine's Abbey, Chilworth


Some topical Reading
