

## **Saint Francis of Assisi's skeleton goes on public display for first time**



Saint Francis of Assisi's skeleton is on full public display for the first time, in a move that is expected to draw hundreds of thousands of visitors.

Inside a nitrogen-filled case with the Latin inscription "Corpus Sancti Francisci" (the body of Saint Francis), the remains are being shown in the Italian hillside town's Basilica of Saint Francis of Assisi.

St Francis, who died on 3 October 1226, founded the Franciscan order after renouncing his wealth and devoting his life to the poor. Giulio Cesareo, the director of communications for the Franciscan convent in Assisi, hoped the display could be "a meaningful experience" for believers and non-believers alike.

Cesareo, a Franciscan friar, said the "damaged" and "consumed" state of the bones showed that St Francis "gave himself completely" to his life's work. His remains, which will be **on display until 22 March 2026**, were transferred to the basilica built in the saint's honour in 1230. But it was only in 1818, after excavations carried out in utmost secrecy, that his tomb was rediscovered. Apart from previous exhumations for inspection and scientific examination, the bones of Saint Francis have only been displayed once, in 1978, to a very limited audience and for only one day.







### **5 weeks to go: Together Alliance March**

On Saturday 28th March, JRS UK will join more than 200 organisations and thousands of people walking through central London with a simple, hopeful conviction: our society is strongest when we choose welcome, dignity, and solidarity.

The Together Alliance March will bring charities, unions, community groups, faith communities and individuals together calling for a future rooted in hope and unity. It will be a joyful, family-friendly event with live music, performances, and activities for children.



We are marching because the landscape for people seeking sanctuary in the UK is becoming increasingly hostile.

Recent and proposed policy changes threaten the ability of refugees to rebuild their lives even after their need for protection is recognised. For people still navigating the system, many will face prolonged destitution, reduced avenues of justice, and an asylum system that may increasingly wrongly refused protection to people who urgently need safety.

This environment is made even more challenging by the rise in inflammatory public language and the misuse of Christian narratives to justify anti-immigration rhetoric.





## UK Benedictine Monks assist Australian school in restoring statue of Our Lady and Child

A touching collaboration between two Roman Catholic institutions has brought together a monastic community in the United Kingdom and a rural school in Australia to restore a cherished statue of Our Lady and the Child Jesus.



Benedictine monks of St Augustine's Abbey, Chilworth responded generously when Michael Green, Principal of Mt Carmel School in Yass, New South

Wales, sought help to repair his school's damaged statue. The figure, deeply loved by pupils and staff, had lost its hands and feet after many years of wear.

Mr Green discovered online the story of a similar statue lovingly restored at the Chilworth monastery and, having exhausted options in Australia, reached out to ask whether the monks' restored statue could serve as a model for recreating the missing parts.

Moved by the school's dedication and the devotional significance of the statue, the monks agreed at once. With the support of specialist 3D scanning company Surfacescan of Ramsgate, UK, a detailed digital scan of the Chilworth statue was produced. This high resolution model will allow precise replicas of the missing hands and feet to be crafted in Australia, ensuring the restoration remains faithful to the original design and tradition.


Alongside the technical assistance, the monks offered their prayers and blessing for the project, remembering Mt Carmel School in their liturgy and asking God's guidance for all involved.

Once completed, the restored statue will continue to inspire prayer and devotion - now enriched by a story of faith, generosity and international cooperation.


## Recruitment drive in Chatham

## Columba Cross presentation




